The Chapel supports through prayer, financially and the work of volunteers, the Oxford Gatehouse, a drop-in centre for homeless people located in St Giles Parish Rooms in the Woodstock Road and supported by an ecumenical range of local churches in Oxford. Last year £1440 was raised for its vital work. In Trinity Term we raised £565 for Christian Aid and £254 on Corpus Christi Day for JCR engagement with Grenfell Tower relief. The Gatehouse is always in need of people who can commit just a few hours a month, behind the scenes preparing food or serving the guests. So whether you are a bit shy or outgoing, there are ways to contribute to its work with homeless people in Oxford.
