The Chapel Choir makes a valuable contribution to the musical life of the whole college and welcomes singers of all faiths or none. See the Organ Scholars, Theodore Hill, Matthew Murphy and Krzysztof Widera for more information.

In the Michaelmas Term the Chapel raised a bumper total of £1,330 to support two charities in Oxford which work with people who are homeless or vulnerable. First, £575 for the Gatehouse which is a day centre in St Giles - we have long connection with this charity and it happens Brian Mountford was the Founding Chairman. And at the two carol services we raised £755 for the Oxford Winter Night Shelter. The OWNS is a new initiative in which seven city centre churches make their plant available for rough sleepers one night a week - so it is a sustainable model for a local congregation. It involves Anglican, Roman Catholic and Free Church local churches.
