UNIVERSITY TUITION FEE (UK & EU Freshers)

For UK and EU students who started in 2011 the annual university tuition fee is £3,465.

For UK and EU students who started since 2012 the annual university tuition fee is £9,000.

You should be able to take out a loan from the Student Loan Company to cover the fees. If you are not taking out a loan the fee (£3,465/£9,000) will be applied to your first battels account at the start of term.

UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE FEES (non-EU Freshers)

FEES

UNIVERSITY FEE (Home/EU)

Most Home/EU graduate students are liable for University tuition fees ranging from £4,052 to £11,590. The BCL and MJuris fee is £15,805. See above for the relevant website to visit for the definitive list of fees.

UNIVERSITY FEE (Overseas)

The University fee for overseas students ranges from £14,845 to £18,220 (much higher for Medical degrees). The BCL and MJuris fee is £20,870. See above for the relevant website to visit for the definitive list of fees.

COLLEGE FEES (All students)

The College fee for most graduate students will be £2,848 for the year.

If you are paying the fees yourself they will be charged to your battels account in three installments to be paid at the start of each term.

Freshers please ensure you have completed and returned the form detailing who is responsible for the payment of your fees.

In the event of a student withdrawing from his/her course the question of a possible refund of all or part of the fee will be considered in the light of the personal circumstances of the individual and the regulations applying at the time.

CONTINUATION FEES

A College continuation fee of £100 per term will be levied on all graduate students who are out of fee time but whose file remains open in the College Office (whether resident in Oxford or not) until submission of thesis. A University continuation fee of £425 per term will be charged to research students who are still under active supervision beyond their maximum period of fee liability.

Graduates will be charged for accommodation from 26th September 2014 to 30th July 2016 (44 weeks) in three 14-week payments at the above rates, invoiced on battels at the beginning of each term (thus allowing two free weeks). During the rest of the year (i.e. until 1st October 2016) they will be charged at the above daily rates.

Graduates vacating their college room for periods of 4 weeks or longer for academic purposes such as medical electives may either retain their room for storage and pay a 50% room rate charge, or empty the room and pay nothing. In either case they must give a month's notice to the Domestic Bursar to be entitled to a rebate.

Any graduate completing their course and vacating their college room before 1st August 2016 may apply to the Domestic Bursar for a rebate. No credit will be given for the two free weeks.

ADVANCE PAYMENT

An advance payment of £200 is charged on a member's first battels. £100 of this will be credited to a meal payment card. The advance payment will be repaid on a member's last battels, less any outstanding accounts due.

PAYMENT OF COLLEGE INVOICE (known as BATTELS)

Battels are presented at the beginning of each term and will be payable within a week of receipt. An end of academic year bill will be sent to a student's home address during July.

Battels at the beginning of each term cover the 'basic' charges (i.e. rent and levies and, for those paying their own fees, the relevant termly fee will be charged) for the coming term and any charges from the previous term and vacation.

Interest is payable on battels which remain unpaid unless an alternative arrangement has been agreed with the Bursar.

JCR LEVIES

There are 2 voluntary levies of £10.00 a term for the JCR charities levy and £5 a term for the JCR levy. In addition a further voluntary levy of £4.50 a term towards the maintenance of a Joint Queen Elizabeth House/Corpus Christi Development Scholar is charged on battels. Students wishing to have more information or to opt out of these levies should speak to the JCR Treasurer.

FACILITIES

Graduate students are full members of the Junior Common Room and have all the facilities available to undergraduate members of the College. There is also a Middle Common Room, to which there is an entry fee of £5.00 and a subscription fee of £15.00 per term.

MAINTENANCE SUPPORT GRANTS

The College has a Maintenance Support Fund from which individual grants are made at the discretion of the Maintenance Support Committee. The details of the scheme, including the application procedure, are published at the appropriate time, and guidelines are given in the *General Information and College Rules*. The University also has a number of forms of financial support; further information can be obtained from the College Office.

INSURANCE AND SECURITY

The College accepts no liability for the loss or damage to any personal possessions, however caused, and this includes any articles stored by the College for Junior Members. The College has arranged a block insurance policy with Endsleigh Insurance Services Limited; this policy provides limited contents insurance cover for all students residing in College accommodation between 24th September 2015 and 23rd September 2016 (and NOT to those living elsewhere). Details of this policy will be provided to all residents, together with information on how they can extend the cover to insure their possessions more fully. Graduates are strongly advised to take out an 'All Risks' insurance policy, and in any event to ensure that bedroom doors are locked at all times.

Every effort is made not to alter fees or charges during the course of the academic year, but the College reserves the right to do so at any time.
