

## GRADUATE ADVISERS

All graduate students are allocated an adviser, generally in a similar subject to their own, to whom they can turn if they are having difficulties. The following is an extract from a letter sent to new graduates:

‘Each graduate student in College is allocated a senior member as his or her Graduate Adviser. Your Adviser is . . . who will be getting in touch with you shortly and will see you at least once a term.’

Our hope is that your Adviser will be a friendly face around the College and also someone with whom you can discuss work informally, as occasion demands. Your Adviser will be sent a copy of your Supervisor's report each term, but we would stress that College Advisers are there to advise and help, not to sit in academic judgement. Please do not hesitate to contact your Adviser if you have any queries or concerns.

If, for any reason, you have reservations about approaching your Adviser, or feel someone working closer to, or further from, your own research topic could be more helpful, just get in touch with me (Tutor for Graduates).’

Graduate adviser lunches are held three times a term. Each graduate therefore has three lunches per year.
