I've served as the chair of the University Counselling Service's management committee, a University Proctor, as part of the group that revised the University's Harassment and Bullying Policy and Procedure recently, as well as having lots of experience in student welfare. I've got a useful grasp of what can feel like a dauntingly complex set of support structures in our College and University as well as the challenges of full time study in Oxford as an undergraduate or graduate. As Dean of Welfare, I am the 'lead' on matters to do with College policy on welfare and meet regularly with Senior Members with welfare responsibilities, Junior Member representatives and Peer Supporters.
