



Lorne Thyssen Graduate Scholarship in Classics

The College intends to offer one fully-funded scholarship to support a student on a DPhil in Classics which focusses on one of the following areas: Greek and/or Roman History, Greek and/or Latin Language and Literature, art and archaeology of antiquity and the reception of antiquity.

The scholarship is open to all new applicants for a DPhil in Classics in the above area.

The scholarship will cover fees and provide a stipend based on the UKRI's minimum doctoral stipend (currently £15,609 p.a.) for the duration of a student's fee liability (normally 3 years) plus an additional year's stipend should a 4th year of study be required.

Application Process

Applicants must submit the following by email to the College's Assistant Academic Registrar (graduate.admissions@ccc.ox.ac.uk) by the closing date (14 January 2022):

- A personal statement describing their research interests, motivations for study and addressing their qualification for the scholarship.
- A research outline for their DPhil
- A Curriculum Vitae

The selection committee will also take into account the references provided in support of the applicant's University application for graduate study.

It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure that all application material for the scholarship is submitted by the deadline (14 January 2022) and that their University application is completed by the University's stated deadline.

Decisions will be made on the basis of the written submissions and references; interviews will not be held. It is hoped that the successful candidate will be notified by 31 March 2022.
